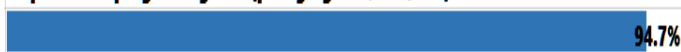

Father's Column

History of Catholicism in North Carolina-Part III....

The ordination of North Carolina's first native Catholic priest, Father Thomas Frederick Price, took place in 1886. Father Price would, who became known as the "Tar Heel Apostle" for his tireless efforts to spread and establish the Catholic faith in North Carolina, left the State in 1911 to co-found the Society of Maryknoll. In 2012, Father Price's Cause for Beatification and Canonization was opened by the Diocese of Raleigh.

The apostolic vicariate comprised the entire state of North Carolina until June 8, 1910, when Gaston, Lincoln, Cleveland, Rutherford, Polk, Burke, McDowell, and Catawba counties were separated from the vicariate and attached to Belmont Abbey through a papal bull of Pope St. Pius X.

Belmont Abbey

Benedictine monks from St. Vincent's Archabbey arrived in the western part of North Carolina acquired land, and started a new foundation in 1876. Pope Leo XIII elevated the priory to an abbey, known as Belmont Abbey, on 19 December 1884, and the monks elected Father Leo Haid as their first abbot. In 1888, Pope Leo XIII appointed Haid as Apostolic Vicar of North Carolina creating the unusual situation in which an abbot possessed episcopal character when he subsequently received episcopal ordination in July of that year.

As much as possible, Bishop Haid tried to juggle the two responsibilities, visiting churches throughout the State and sending his Benedictine monks out to render priestly service. There was a natural tension, however, between the demands placed on a missionary priest and the routine of work, prayer and stability required of a monk.

This arrangement became even more unusual when Pope Pius X designated Belmont Abbey as a territorial abbey, taking Gaston, Catawba, Cleveland, Burke, Lincoln, McDowell, Polk, and Rutherford Counties from the Vicariate Apostolic of North Carolina, making the territorial abbey a suffragan of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, thus created two particular churches united in the person of their ordinary, neither of which was a diocese. This arrangement endured until the death of Abbot/Bishop Haid on 24 July 1924.

Diocese of Raleigh

When the Diocese of Raleigh was created by Pope Pius XI in 1924, it covered virtually the entire state of North Carolina except for that part administered by Belmont Abbey. Sacred Heart Church, recently constructed in downtown Raleigh as a parish church, was designated the Cathedral for the new diocese. Ministering and evangelizing in this approximately 54,000 square mile area with 6,193 Catholics were 31 priests and 84 women religious. The new diocese contained 21 parishes, 40 missions with churches and 60 stations – locations where priests visited as they could, often celebrating Mass in private homes.
