Rite of Ordination of a Bishop

As the Diocese of Charlotte welcomes its fifth bishop, Bishop Michael Martin, it may be of interest to see what the rite of ordination looks like for a Catholic bishop.

After a hymn to the Holy Spirit, the bishop-elect is presented to the main consecrator bishop. The letter of appointment by the pope is then read. The bishop-elect then promises to fulfill his role as bishop. Everyone sings the litany of the saints to invoke heaven's aid as the bishop-elect lies prostrate on the floor. Afterwards, all bishops present lay hands on his head.

While the Book of Gospels is held above the head of the Bishop-elect, the principal consecrator begins the prayer of ordination. In the midst of that prayer is the actual form of the sacrament. Correct recitation of this part of the prayer is necessary for validity, so all three co-consecrators pray that section: "Pour out now upon this chosen one that power which is from you, the governing Spirit, whom you gave to your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, the Spirit whom he bestowed upon the holy Apostles, who established the Church in each place as your sanctuary for the glory and unceasing praise of your name."

Now that he is ordained a bishop the rite continues with the anointing of the bishop's head with sacred chrism, signifying the full share in the priesthood of Christ which he has received through the laying on of hands and the prayer of ordination. He is then presented with the Book of the Gospels while the principal consecrator says: "Receive the Gospel and preach the word of God with all patience and sound teaching."

The principal consecrator then places a ring on the ring finger of the newly ordained saying: "Receive this ring, the seal of fidelity: adorned with undefiled faith, preserve unblemished the bride of God, the holy Church." The miter is then placed on the head of the new bishop while hearing: "Receive the miter, and may the splendor of holiness shine forth in you, so that when the chief shepherd appears you may deserve to receive from him an unfading crown of glory."

Lastly, the bishop receives the pastoral staff: "Receive the crosier, the sign of your pastoral office: and keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has placed you as Bishop to govern the Church of God." The newly ordained bishop is then escorted to his seat, which is a sign of his new episcopal authority.
